The \$1,500 they raised will help Go4TheGoal in the fight against pediatric cancers.

Temple Avodat Shalom honored Heather a few years ago with the Hinani Award. "Hinani means 'Here I am' in Hebrew," Heather says. "I received it for all the work I have done over the years for my temple and community. Some of that consists of building an entire young family group for the temple, recruiting many new young members, running young family events and Shabbat services and prayers, helping feed the hungry, donating to the midnight run, and much more. In honor of winning the award, the temple has a wonderful ceremony in my honor. It was truly wonderful!"

Being daughter Siena's Girl Scout leader has been very fulfilling for Heather. Some of the charitable work she has done with Girl Scouts include filming a PSA for Englewood Health to promote breast cancer awareness month, decorating Valentine's Day cookies and cupcakes with residents at a home for the aged, collecting socks and toiletries
